All that said, I should have been absolutely delighted by the news that John Hurt would be appearing in *Doctor Who*. I was, too, but I was also filled with Whovian trepidation when, at the end of "The Name of the Doctor," he was suddenly announced as a previously unknown past Doctor. My mind reeled. I loved John Hurt, but geez, now I had to ask myself: Did I love him enough to wrap my head around there being a new Doctor to think of. More importantly, did I love him enough to change my whole Doctor numbering system?! If Eleven was now going to be Twelve, and Ten was now Eleven, and a train was going x miles for y hours, and the square on the hypotenuse equaled the sum of the square on the other two sides, then my head was surely going to explode. I am not a huge fan of math, you see. I have no idea why a mouse, for example, is when it spins.

What I'm saying, of course, is that I was concerned that Steven Moffat had gone off the deep end and that he was about to ruin our favorite show in some hellish never-before considered way.

But then "Night of the Doctor" came, and that was a beautiful surprise.
